ArtCenter Manatee's goal in participating in the 2015 Giving Challenge is to raise awareness of the valuable contributions the arts make in our lives and in the life of our community. The ArtCenter has invited members, friends and community leaders to give voice to the reasons art matters to them. From providing an incentive for new residents and businesses looking for a community with a strong arts and culture environment, to artists who credit the arts with adding vibrancy, meaning and confidence to their lives, to children who value the creative expression and problem solving challenges arts allows them. According to one longtime friend of the ArtCenter:

Art also helps builds self-confidence, has a positive effect on our cognitive ability, critical thinking skills and our problem solving capabilities. Art also builds relationships through commonality and inclusion. So what some previously thought as pass time for those with artistic ability is now understood to be a vehicle for academic performance, wellness, and the health and vibrancy of our communities. ArtCenter Manatee has witnessed this impact for many years through our classes and exhibits.
